## Simply the Best

Congratulations to all of the hard-working employees in [ACCESS Florida](#) for a job well done! For the third year in a row, ACCESS Florida earned the distinction of having the best payment accuracy rate in the nation for the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), 0.78 percent. Not only was Florida recognized as the best nationally, it was also awarded a SNAP High Performance Bonus of just over \$6 million. Great job, ACCESS Florida!

## Strive to Drive Challenge

DCF, [Best Foot Forward Foundation](#), a nonprofit organization that supports youth in foster care, and Offlease Only, a Lake Worth used car dealer, have teamed up to change lives – in a big way. Offlease Only will donate one car per month to a Palm Beach County foster care youth who has reached their 18th birthday and aged out of custodial care. The Strive to Drive Challenge not only alleviates the transportation issues the youth face upon leaving the system, but rewards them for their efforts and motivation to stay in school and helps them achieve self-sufficiency. Best Foot Forward and Offlease Only presented the first car on July 23rd to Manny Oliver, a young man who aged out of foster care and now works for the Department in ACCESS.
